BRILLIANT BRACEWELL BAGS AUDI MEDAL

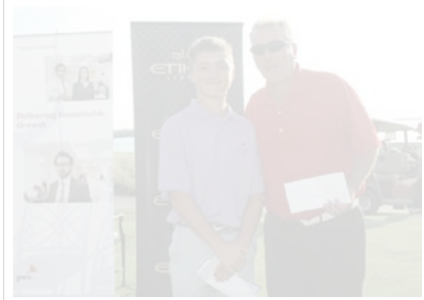

LEHMKUHL STORMS TO VICTORY

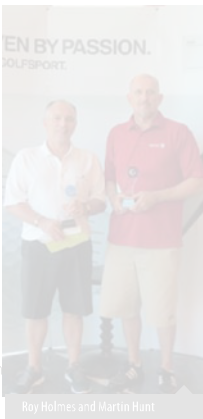

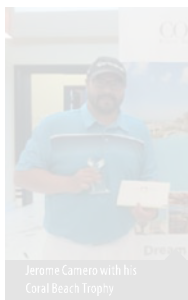


Roy Holmes and Martin Hunt

MICHAEL HARRADINE SEALS FIFTH SHARJAH TITLE

SGSC Michael Harradine clinched his fifth Men's Open at SGSC last month with a play-off win over Ryan Hunter. The pair were locked on 2-over-par through 36 holes in the two-day event and in the end it was the experienced Harradine who triumphed with a bogey to Hunter's double bogey.

Harradine shook off a fast start from a host of names as play got underway on day two but Hunter remained in contention and made the event a two-man race. Harradine made birdies on holes 15 and 16 to move clear but then bogeyed holes 17 and 18 to drop back into a tie with Hunter. However, after

Hunter missed the green in the play-off and then needed two chips to find the putting surface the tie was effectively over.

Barry Cotter took third place on 4-over par with Al Hamra GC professional Simon Dunn also posting the same score but had to settle for fourth place after losing out on a countback.

The Net champion was Roger Ledeboer as he clinched his first major title with a net 2-under score, followed by fellow SGSC members Jalal Al Abbassi and Imran Akhtar in second and third place respectively.

NAMIR'S NAME ON ANOTHER MIDWEEK MEDAL
